18 TAKE ACTION — A. S. C. Office Accepting Burley Bank Applications

Applications are now being accepted by the local A.S.C. office from farmers wanting to place their 1958 burley tobacco acreage in the Soil Bank.

As of Monday, 18 burley producers had taken this action, according to Miss Mildred Corbin, manager of the A.S.C. office.

Farmers who participated in the 1957 Acreage Reserve will be eligible for a 10 per cent increase in

their '58 payment if they designate the same acreage they did for 1957, she explained.

March 7 is the deadline for signing for the Soil Bank. However, Miss Corbin urges farmers to sign as soon as possible since the \$5,196 allocated for Macon County might be exhausted before the deadline.

She said the funds are used on a first-come-first-serve basis.

Perry Named Chairman Of 'Egg Month'

Kenneth Perry, assistant county agent here, has been named "March Egg Month" chairman for Macon County.

His appointment was announced this week by Harry Gibbs of Asheville, chairman for Western North Carolina.

The "March Egg Month" program is being conducted on a state-wide and national basis to encourage the consumption of more eggs. The program in North Carolina is being sponsored by the State Department of Agriculture, North Carolina State College, and the Poultry and Egg National Board.

Mr. Gibbs terms this program important, both to the consumers in the state and to egg producers. He added that egg consumption in North Carolina is low. The average North Carolinian eats about two dozen eggs per year less than the average for the U. S. That means we need to eat more eggs for health's sake. Theme of the program is "Eggs are right — morning, noon, and night."

Egg production is an important industry in the state. Approximately 80,000 farm families in North Carolina sell eggs.

A planning meeting, which the county chairmen will attend, will be held on Thursday night, February 20, at 7 p.m. at Tingle's Cafe on Broadway Street in Asheville. Also participating in this meeting will be the poultry commission of the Asheville Agricultural Development Council, which will assist with the area program.

Principal speaker will be Wayne A. Corpening of Winston-Salem, state chairman for "March Egg Month."

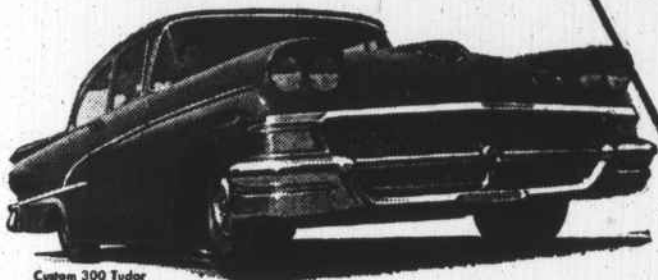
