Solomon Maloff, who operated a store in Franklin at one time, died February 15 at his home in Bryson City, following a long illness.

Born in Beirut, Lebanon, he came to the United States when he was 19. He first sold housewares house-to-house in Atlanta, Ga., and he later entered the mercantile business there.

Later he came to Franklin, where he and Joe Ashear operated a store, "Ashear and Maloff", in 1911. From Franklin, Mr. Maloff went to Hellen, Ga., and later to Bryson City, where he became a well-known businessman.

At the time of his death, he was serving as a town alderman.
