Former Highlands Minister Passes In Chapel Hill

The Rev. Alfred Straton Lawrence, 76, an Episcopal minister who served in Highlands and Cashiers at one time, died March 28 in Chapel Hill, where he had been active in the affairs of the Episcopal Chapel of the Cross for 37 years.

He had served as rector of the Chapel Hill church from 1921 to 1943, and as rector emeritus since 1943.

Born in Essex, England, he was graduated from Columbia University with a master's degree in 1905. He received his bachelor of divinity degree from the general theological seminary. A chaplain during World War II, Mr. Lawrence also served parishes in Concord, Lenoir, and Hillsboro.

He is survived by his wife, the former Miss Elsie Millicent Perkins, whom he married in 1909, and two sons and three daughters.
