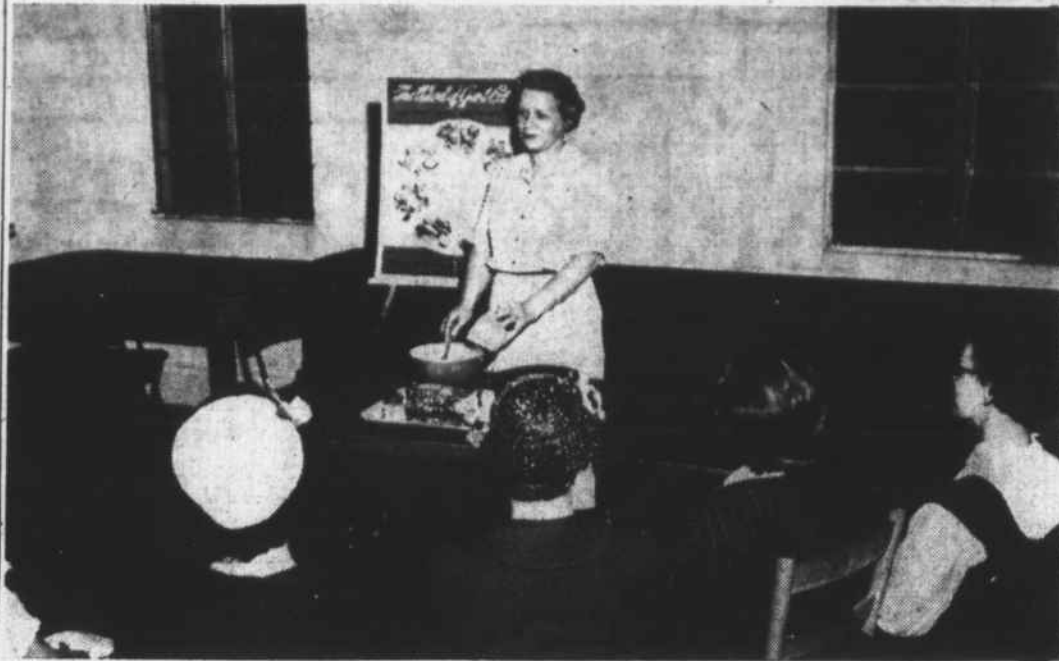




As a project this year, the women of the Cowee Home Demonstration Club have been taking surplus army blankets and hemming them for the first graders of Cowee School. (Staff Photo)

Loan Fund Established To Aid Girls

Did you know North Carolina home demonstration club women are sponsoring loan funds for the youth of the state? Many homemakers realize what improved education can do for our homes of tomorrow. So here in Macon County a part of annual club dues, which are 50c a year, help support these loan funds. Truly educated homemakers will help "Today's Home Build Tomorrow's World". Mrs. Emma R. Help Themselves

"Help Youth Help Itself" is what the Jane S. McKimmon Loan Fund has endeavored to do for 25 years. This loan fund has been one of the outstanding achievements of the North Carolina Federation of Home Demonstration Clubs.

As a tribute of love and affection for their state home demonstration agent, the Home Agents' Association of North Carolina in December, 1927, established this loan fund, to be called the Jane S. McKimmon Loan Fund, and to be used to aid rural girls in attending college to pursue their studies in home economics. Later, this policy was broadened to include loans to rural girls desiring a college education in any field.

This fund is in charge of a committee known as the Jane S. McKimmon Educational Loan Committee.

All applicants for loans must be rural residents of North Carolina, who are able to present
