overhaul is needed. Its major recommendations, which would require a constitutional amendment, are, briefly:

A single, unified, North Carolina court, with the power to make the rules for the mechanics operating the courts and for trying cases in them trans-

ferred from the Legislature to the State Supreme Court.

Relatively few changes would be made in the supreme and superior courts, but the varied courts below the level of the superior court would be replaced by a single court in each of several districts, with one or more magistrates, under the district court, in each county. These district judges and the magistrates under them would be appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, from among nominees submitted to him by the resident superior court judge.

Under this unified court plan, the administrative officer of the entire court system would be the chief justice, who would be given authority to assign judges and supervise the courts of the state.

The selection of citizens for jury service would be put in the hands of sworn jury commissioners, who would operate under supervision of the superior court judges.

Solicitors would be placed under the supervision of the state attorney general.
