A nursery staffed by two persons is now operating Sunday mornings at the First Baptist Church. In charge are Mrs. George Elliott and Mrs. Homer Joines.

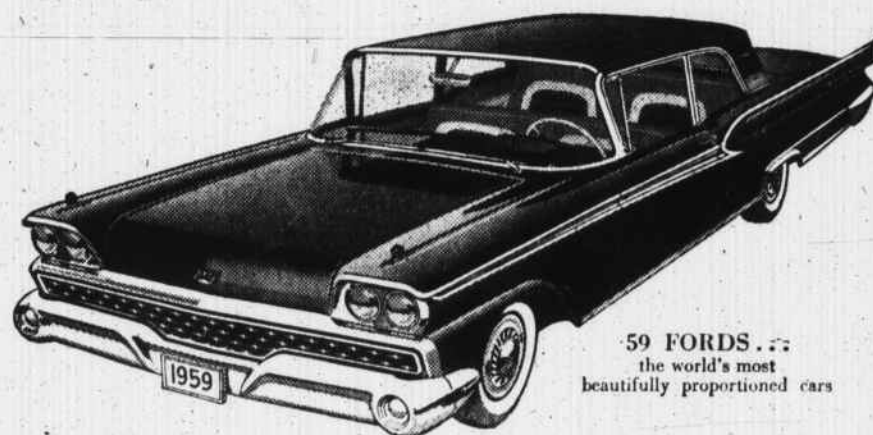
