**FRANKLIN STUDENT LEADER — UNC Students Deny Being Lobbyists — Aren't Paid**

CHAPEL HILL — They have been called lobbyists, but they deny it.

"We are not lobbyists because none of us are paid," said Norman B. Smith, of Franklin, student in the University of North Carolina who heads a state-wide organization of men students and coeds at Chapel Hill in making contacts with members of the 1959 General Assembly.

More than a hundred students representing all the counties in North Carolina have arranged their own campaign to show legislators what UNC needs for the biennium, 1959-61.

Acting entirely on their own volition, without prodding from university officials, the students are running their own "contact organization."

During the recent holidays, students consulted with legislators in the home towns, with Carolina undergraduates home for Christmas calling on legislators in their local communities.

This will be followed up, Mr. Smith said, by visits to Raleigh during the legislative sessions, and also a television program the last week in February.

In making it a student do-it-yourself project, the students prepared a mimeographed booklet, showing the requested budget for the university at Chapel Hill, together with reasons why they think the appropriations are justified.

Mr. Smith pointed out the fact that no student "lobbyist" is paid and therefore will not have to register as a lobbyist.

"We did our own mimeographing and paid for it all," said Mr. Smith, "and the few phone calls we made were at our own personal expense."

Legislators were impressed by visits from their home-town constituents who are enrolled at Chapel Hill. Each student brought back to the campus a report of his or her interview with local representatives and senators.

One legislator told his caller, "This is the first time in my 20 years in the legislature that a student has called on me to talk about Chapel Hill and the appropriations needed there. I like to see it."

Legislators went over the budget with the students in many cases and made firm or generalized commitments on certain items, or said they would maintain a "wait and see" attitude on certain items.

In the confidential reports the students brought back for their future use they "sized up" each legislator, his attitude toward the university and education in general, and what the likelihood is for counting on his support.

It is emphasized that the program is entirely student inspired and student directed. The students asked officials of the university to provide information for their use, which the University did.
