

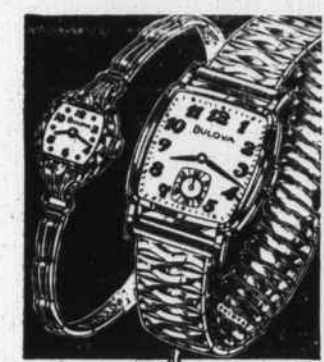

**Attending Meeting**  
 Miss Mildred Corbin, office manager, and Mrs. Grace Tatham, administrative clerk, of the Macon County A.S.C. office, attended an area quarterly staff conference in Asheville January 29-30.

**Reminder Given**  
 Max Parrish, chairman of the Macon County A.S.C. Committee, reminds farmers that the marketing year under the 1958 wool program will end March 31. The wool program is conducted under the National Wool Act of 1954. Payments under the 1958 program will be made this summer when the payment rates are determined on the basis of national average prices received by producers for shorn wool during the 1958 marketing year. Any marketings after March 31 will be eligible under the 1959 program. If any condition concerning the sale is not settled by March 31, the sale will not be considered as completed. Title must have passed to the buyer, the wool must have been delivered to the buyer and the last of the factors (price per pound, weight, yield, etc.) needed to determine the total purchase must be made. Applications for payment under the 1958 program must be filed with the county A.S.C. office not later than April 30, 1959.
