A short time ago, the eighth grade at Union School made a science experiment.

Items used included a large bottle, thin strips of an aluminum pie plate, lye, water, a balloon, and some string.

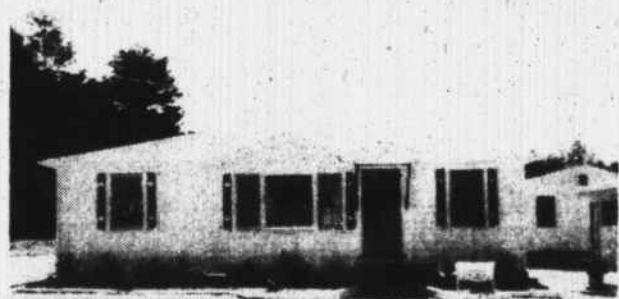
