**New Bills**

A bill was introduced this week in the House placing a three cent tax per pack on cigarettes and comparable taxes on other tobacco products. Proponents of this measure say this tax would bring in about twelve million dollars.

Now is the time to carry out the gardening plans made earlier in the year. Have you planned to try a new vegetable this year? It's not too late to plant an asparagus bed. Asparagus is an expensive delicacy that can be easily grown throughout our state. Cover the roots with about two inches of soil and then gradually fill this furrow as the plant begins growth. Asparagus responds to soils high in organic matter, thus mixing manure, sawdust, or compost with the soil before planting is a good idea. A straw mulch will keep the weeds and grass down throughout the summer.

Do you buy your tomato and pepper plants? Recent reports indicate that diseases have wiped out up to 90 percent of the pepper and tomato crops in parts of Florida. This means that plants coming from these areas this year will be more dangerous than ever. It would be wise to ask where the plants were grown before buying, and choose plants grown elsewhere.

Do you have the fertilizer recommendation bulletin for this year? It is available at the county agricultural agent's office. This bulletin is valuable for year round reference, and has general recommendations for fertilizing vegetable crops, apples and peaches, fruits, lawns, and ornamentals as well as field crops. It is yours for the asking.

Gardening is a family affair. Encouragement is given to 4-H boys and girls through the garden contest, but they will need added help and patient assistance by families and local leaders. We can all help with this project by showing our interest. A good garden is one way of providing the food we need for a well fed family.
