Representative Umstead, of Orange County, received a fine present last week when 86 members of the House lined up in favor of a four and one-half million dollar new training school in Western North Carolina for the mentally retarded.

Representative Umstead has done much for North Carolina's mentally ill in his 12 terms of service in the Legislature. A great deal is now being done for these sick people and Representative Umstead deserves the thanks of all North Carolinians for his fine service to the state.

The Appropriations Committee ended its hearings and is now getting down to the real work of trying to arrive at the budget. This is a tedious process and, in the final analysis, the Finance Committee will attempt to raise the necessary money to get the Appropriations' quota. With the proposed 10% raise of school teachers and state employees still being debated in committee, the Finance Committee is looking for ways to raise new taxes. Perhaps a compromise bill will be approved and it is just possible, with the accelerated tax payments, that no new taxes will need to be levied.
