Micromounts Lecture Set In Highlands

HIGHLANDS "Rockhounds" and "pebble pups" of the area will have an unusual opportunity to learn about micromounts August 20, at 8 p.m., in the Museum of Natural History when Louis Perloff, of Winston-Salem, gives an illustrated lecture on micromounts.

Micromounts are not only miniature crystals, but they are the most perfect crystals. Collectors of micromounts take a rock and examine it for perfect crystals, say of tourmaline, garnet, apatite, or others, and will delicately mount a cluster in a box where the material must be viewed with a magnifying glass or microscope.

Mr. Perloff has an outstanding collection of micromounts, his specimens having come from all parts of the world. He is an excellent

90,000th Landing Made On Thompson's Carrier In July

EAST COAST (PTHTNC) — Harry R. Thompson, commander, USN son of Mr. and Mrs. Jess Thompson, of Route 4, Franklin, N. C., is serving aboard the attack aircraft carrier USS Essex which in late July had the 90,000th aircraft landing made on her decks while the ship was conducting

operations off the East Coast.

The Essex, oldest combatant carrier in active service in the Navy, holds the record for carrier landings on ships still in commission. The record of 97,549 landings is held by the old USS Saratoga, which was sunk at Bikini Atoll during the A-bomb tests in 1947.

The landings represent over 45
