

**TAX NOTICE**

MACON COUNTY, N. C.

Your 1959 County Taxes became due October 1, 1959, and are payable with NO INTEREST added through February 1, 1960. This is according to the laws of the State of North Carolina. Thereafter interest will be charged according to the schedule shown below:

After February 1 and through March 1—Add 1%  
After March 1 and through April 1—Add 2%  
After April 1 and through May 1—Add 2½%  
After May 1 and through June 1—Add 3%  
After June 1 and through July 1—Add 3% and 1% per month, to date of sale of tax lien.

If paid after February 1, 1960, add interest according to above schedule.

Be sure to pay before February 1, 1960 and avoid interest.
