ABOUT YOUR Social Security

Protection aganist loss of income ecause of retirement, death, or disability is available to farmers since 1955 under the Social Security Law. A farmer obtains Social Security credits if his net earnings are at least \$400 a year. If his net earnings are less than this amount he may elect to file under the optional method, if his gross is at least \$600.

Farmers must file an income tax return and a Schedule "F" each year that their net is \$400 or more or if they choose the optional method of reporting. Filing an in come tax return does not mean that you must pay federal income tax. Payment of income tax is dependent upon your earnings status. However, a self-employment tax must be paid on your farm earnings of \$400 or more, or the amount determined by the optional method of reporting.
