County's Forest Picture Brought Out In Survey

A report entitled "Forest Facts for Western North Carolina", prepared by the Asheville Agricultural Development Council, presents a thumbnail sketch of Macon County's forests and the processing of forest products.

R. A. Campbell, leader, Asheville Research Center, U. S. Forest Service, and R. A. Vogenberger, TVA forester, Asheville, chairman of the Forestry Commission.

"Forests are basic to the progress and economic well-being of all Western North Carolina counties," the report points out.

Convincing proof is offered of this statement. In the 23 county area, forests occupy 75 per cent of the total land area. This ranges from 44 per cent in Alleghany county to over 90 per cent in Swain and Transylvania counties.

The over 18 thousand workers employed by the forest and wood-using industries in the area comprise one-third of the industrial employees of the area, or approximately the same number as are employed in the textile industries.

The combined annual payroll of the industrial and non-industrial workers in the 23 county area who depend directly upon the forests and the wood-using industries for employment totals an estimated \$82,370,000.

Notify Office All farmers buying or selling land are responsible for notifying the A.S.C. office in order that the farm records may be kept current at all times.

If cropland is involved in the trade, the tobacco allotment will be affected. Therefore, it is important that the farms be properly reconstituted prior to the beginning of the planting season.

Allotments are divided according to the regulations of the Department of Agriculture and agreements by the owners on how the allotment should be divided can not be accepted, except in a case where an estate is being divided among the heirs.

Cost-Sharing Government cost-sharing under the 1960 Agricultural Conservation Program is available to Macon County farmers. There are various practices in the county program to meet every major soil conserving problem in Macon County.
