
All farmers buying or selling land are responsible for notifying the A.S.C. office in order that the farm records may be kept current

If cropland is involved in the trade, the tobacco allotment will be affected. Therefore, it is important that the farms be properly reconstituted prior to the beginning of the planting season. All persons anticipating selling or buying farmland should contact the allotment before closing the deal. By so doing, neither party will be
