Patrol Adopts Light Project

A "Darkness to Light" program to correct improper lights on motor vehicles is being undertaken by Troop F of the State Highway Patrol.

Emphasizing that 53 per cent of all fatal accidents occur during night hours, Sgt. T. A. Sandlin this week said all service station operators in the troop area are being asked to cooperate in the program by checking lights when vehicles stop at their stations and informing the drivers of the defects.

"If you are told by an attendant that you have faulty lights, do not think that he is being meddlesome. He is voluntarily cooperating in a program to make your driving safer. If you are told that your lights are bad, won't you have them fixed immediately?" the patrol officer asked in a statement to newspapers.

Patrolmen H. T. Ferguson and P. T. Miller, who are assigned to this county, have requested the cooperation of local stations in the "Darkness to Light" program. The officers also point out that it is a violation of the Motor Vehicles Law to operate a vehicle with improper lights.

In addition to Macon County, Troop F is composed of Jackson, Clay, Cherokee, Graham, and Swain.

that the ruby mines bring in more income from tourists than any other attraction and asked that funds be appropriated to make the road to the mines an all-weather thoroughfare. Mr. Mr. Hutchison replied that special funds could be appropriated to improve this road.

Macon County School Supt. H. Bueck and Franklin Mayor W. C. Burrell requested that all school bus roads in the county be improved to assure that they would be passable for busses five days a week. The division engineer assured these officials that these school bus roads would get top priority for improvements.

The engineer also revealed that US 441 between Franklin and Dillsboro, which has been broken in spots by slides, would not be closed this summer in spite of the trouble. He explained that detours could be cut through the mountain to by-pass any places which were ruined by slides.

It was also told that a construction contract for the relocation of the eight-mile stretch of US 64 between Franklin and Gneiss would be let in 1961.

Aerial photos for survey purposes already have been made on this stretch, the engineer said, and a survey crew probably will begin groundwork this summer.

Many other private citizens presented petitions to the of-

ficials, mainly requesting improvements on unpaved state roads, which were badly deteriorated by last winter's rough weather.

Several persons interested in selling real estate asked that roads bordering lots listed for sale be improved to increase the value of this property and act to bring in more people to the county.
