Funeral services for Wilford Holden Thompson, 70, a Macon County native who had lived at Cashiers for the past 20 years, were held Sunday, May 15, in the Sugarfork Baptist Church. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Mr. Thompson died Saturday, May 14, at 12:30 a.m. in a Highlands hospital after an illness of five days.

Born July 26, 1889 in Macon County, he was the son of Jasper and Mrs. Amanda Ingram Thompson. On January 26, 1912 he married Miss Alice Estes of Cullasaja community. Mr. Thompson's occupation was farming and he was a member of the Cashiers Baptist Church.
