Guests of Mr. and Mrs. Junior Wilcox were her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Vic Denton, of Marion, last week.

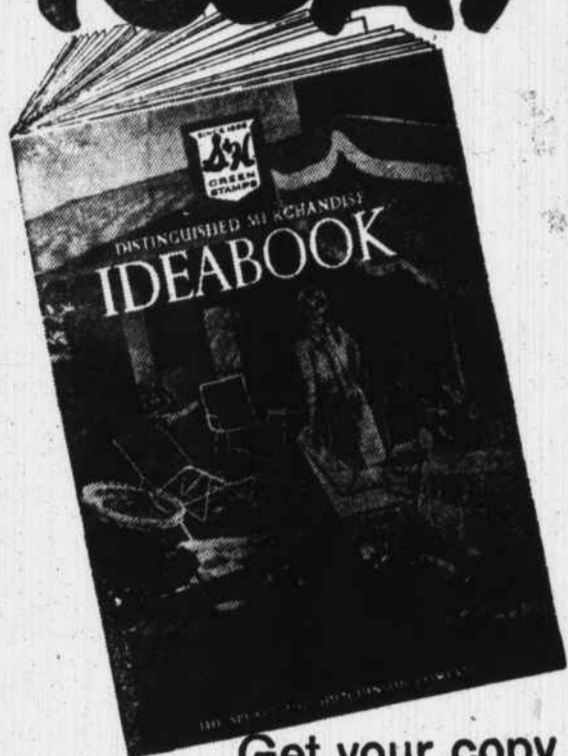

Mr. and Mrs. Homer Greene have returned home from Arcata, Calif.

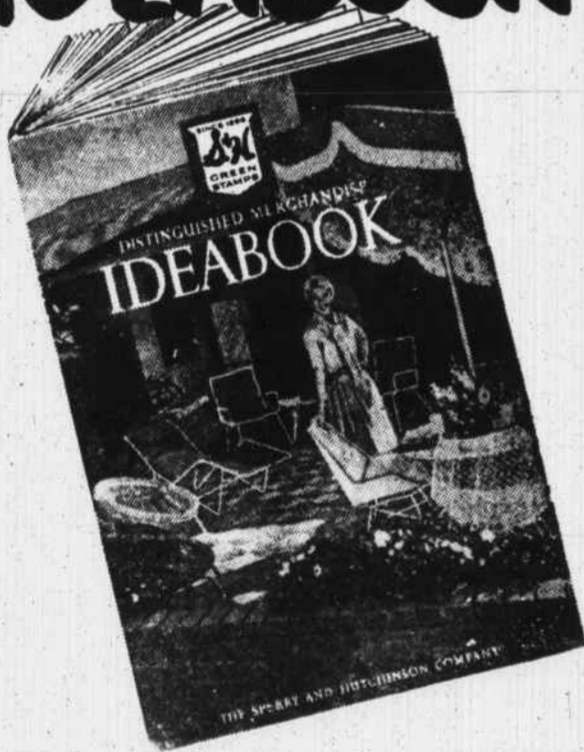
