**F. H. A. Loans Now
Made To Landowners
Not Living On Farm**

He says any landowner may make application for a loan to remodel his dwelling, add an extra room or bath, construct a new

dwelling or to build any necessary building on the farm, providing he makes as much as \$400 per year from that farm.

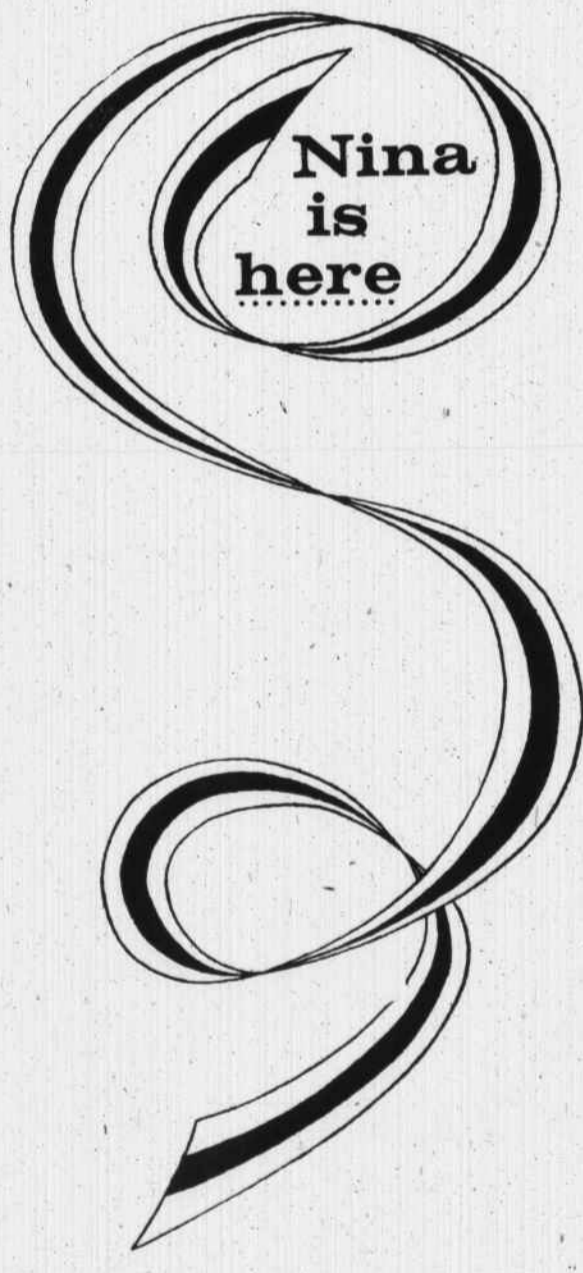
