Economic Survey Of Area By Commission Predicted

Western North Carolina Regional Planning Commission held its quarterly meeting at the Jarrett House in Dillsboro Wednesday, August 24, with more than 100 leading citizens from the 11-county area present.

financial condition was good and that all members had paid their annual dues for the past year. He also said that statements of dues were now being sent out to members for the new fiscal year.

Mr. Stephens also reported, as chairman of the committee to look into the financing of a proposed economic study of the entire region, that six of the leading industrial firms of the area had expressed interest and that the committee was optimistic in the prospects of arranging the financing for the survey and felt that the actual survey would be under way before the next quarterly meeting. The study is designed to give local governments, manufacturing firms, transportation and utility corporations, some insight into the region's economic potential and point up some of the deficiencies of which the region is unaware.

John R. Hampton, the commission's planning director, in further commenting on the proposed economic survey, stated that with such a survey we will have something to "form a firm basis for the further physical development of the region".

H. Bueck, of Franklin, then introduced Democratic gubernatorial nominee Terry Sanford, a guest of the commission, who addressed the meeting. In Mr. Sanford's address he said that Western North Carolina is the state's last great economic frontier and predicted a glowing future for it. He further said "It is going to grow and come into its own and I am glad you have the wisdom to see that it grows in an orderly way".

He commented, "I am impressed. The fact that people like you, who are in other businesses, are interested enough to give of your time, your brains and your energy, to work for the future development of your area impressed me
