## WAS MACON NATIVE — George Parrish Dies At Daughter's Home

George T. Parrish, one of Macon County's few nonagenarians, died November 24 at 5 a. m., at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Hallie Duvall, of Franklin, Route 3.

A farmer, he was 94 years old and had been ill only a short time.

Funeral services were conducted the afternoon of the 26th at the Burningtown Baptist Church, of which he was a member. Officiating were the Rev. Bill Sorrells and the Rev. Jud Duvall. Burial was in Woodlawn Cemetery.

Born Oct. 23, 1866, Mr. Parrish was the son of Nat and Mrs. Martha Jane Parrish. He was married in 1890 to Miss Beulah Porter, of this county.

Survivors include a son, T. Ralph Parrish, of Brevard; three daughters, Mrs. Hallie Duvall, Mrs. W. E. Baldwin, and Mrs. Vernon Pruitt, all of Route 3; three brothers, Jim, Edd, and R. L.
