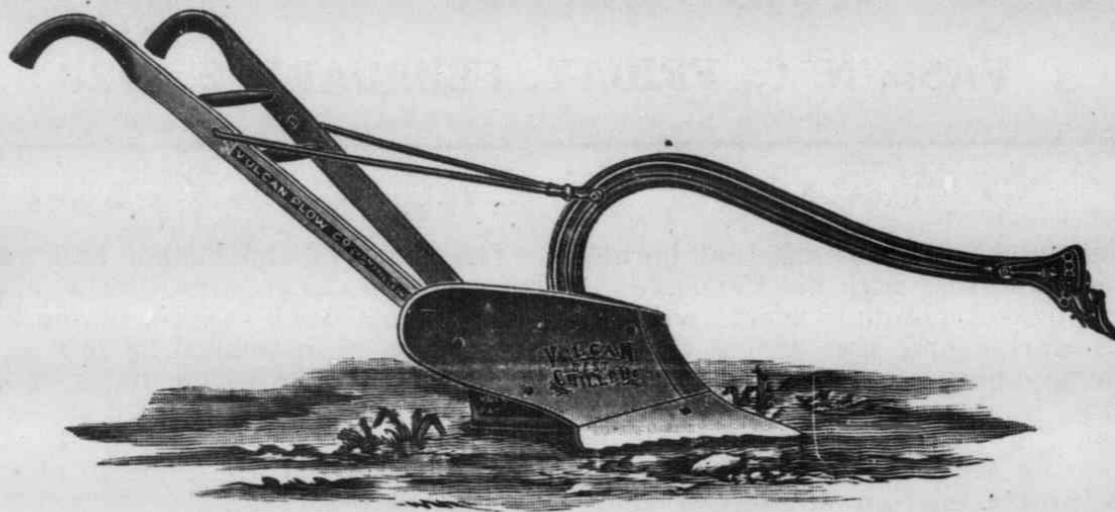

Mr. and Mrs. Walter Thomas, of Broadway, spent Sunday with Mrs. Laura Rogers.

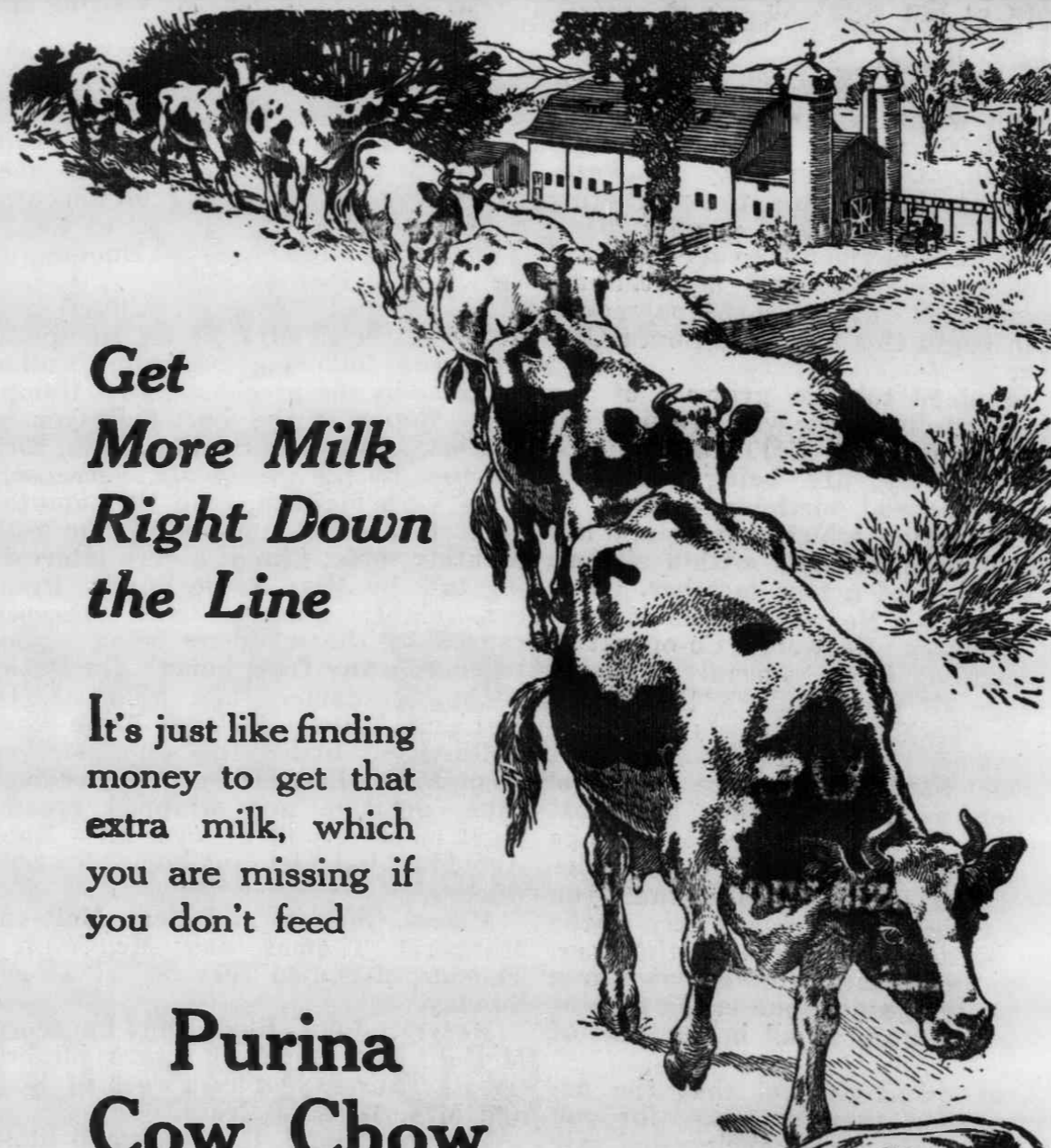
