

NOTICE OF COMMISSIONER'S SALE OF LAND

North Carolina, Moore County. In the Superior Court W. T. Fletcher and R. L. Poindexter, vs.

M. W. Wall and Nancy Wall and his wife, et als. By virtue of a judgment of the Superior Court of Moore County entered in the above entitled action, the undersigned Commissioner will, on Monday, the 5th day of May, 1924, at 12 o'clock noon, at the court house door of said county, sell to the highest bidder, for cash, those certain tracts or parcels of land lying and being in McNeills Township, Moore County, State of North Carolina, described and bounded as follows:

First Tract: Lying and being between Mill Creek and McDeeds Creek and beginning at a stake in Pope's line about 30 yards north the Ray house, and having a persimmon pointer, running thence with Pope's line North 19 W. 9 chains and 3 links to a stake in William Seawards' line, Pope's corner; thence as Seawards' line N. 69 E. 12.40 chains to a stake, two pine and maple pointers, on the east edge of a small lake, Will Seawards' corner; thence S. 40 E. 7.65 chains to a stake; thence S. 62 W. 15.30 chains to the first station, containing 11.4 acres, more or less.

Second Tract: Beginning at a stake, Pope and Wilson's corner, and running thence South 60-02 East six hundred and fifty-six feet to a stake, one of the corners of the Block land, now Powell's; thence with said line S. 43-06 W. five hundred and ninety-one feet to a stake in said line; thence North 46-54 West Fourteen hundred and forty feet to a stake; thence North 27-49 East three hundred and seventy-six feet to a stake, one of the corners of the 43rd tract; thence South 75-25 East one hundred and thirty-seven feet, another corner of the 43rd tract; thence a distance of about seven hundred and ninety-seven feet to the beginning corner, containing fifteen acres, more or less.

Third Tract: Beginning at a stake in the Block line, and running thence North 85-14 West sixteen hundred and fourteen feet to a stake; thence North 39-56 West seven hundred and sixty-five feet to a stake; thence North 66-02 West six hundred and fifty-eight feet; thence North 48-33 East ten hundred and twenty-six feet to a stake; thence North 03-33 East six hundred and sixty-three feet to a stake; thence South 89-59 East five hundred and sixty-one feet to a stake; thence South 25-15 East sixteen hundred and thirty-six feet to a stake; thence South 36-45 East ten hundred and sixty feet to the beginning, containing 67.7 acres, more or less.

Fourth Tract: Lying on the South side of Mill Creek, beginning at an iron post at the south edge of Mill Creek swamp, a corner of the George McDeamid land, running thence S. 42 1/2 E. 12.00 chains to a stake, Duckworth's corner; thence N. 51 1/2 E. 15.50 chains to a stake near a small branch; thence N. 6 1/2 E. 10.00 chains to a stake in the south edge of Mill Creek swamp; thence N. 84 W. 10.00 chains; thence S. 46 W. 11.50 chains; thence direct to the beginning, containing 26.86 acres.

Fifth Tract: Beginning at a stake in the line of Bush land, running N. 73 1/2 E. 8.23 chains to a stake near the Kenneth Ray house; thence N. 19 W. 10.05 chains to a stake in W. H. Seawards line; thence on Seawards line S. 69 W. 7.04 chains to a stake, pines pointers; thence S. 12 E. 9.50 chains to the first station, containing 7.35 acres.

Sixth Tract: Beginning at a stake at the head of a ditch on the north side of Mill Creek having a maple, sweet gum and poplar pointers running S. 13.27 chains to a stake in an old field, 3 pines pointers; thence E. 6.12 chains to a stake by the West side of a branch, two black gums and pine pointers; thence S. 40 E. 11.45 chains to a pine stump, one blackgum pointers above a marsh; thence S. 85 E. 8.2 links to a stake; thence S. 38 E. 5.50

chains to a stake, Gardner's corner; thence N. 38 1/2 E. 35.00 chains crossing Mill Creek to a pine (now down) Gardner's and R. A. Smith's corner; thence on R. A. Smith's line S. 40 E. crossing Mill Creek to Smith's corner at McDeeds Creek; thence up the channel of McDeeds Creek to a corner of the Griswald Land Co.; thence on their line N. 4.75 chains to a stake in a branch, two blackgums and poplar pointers; thence on their other line N. 81 W. 27.22 chains to a stake, their corner; thence N. 11 1/2 W. 3.75 chains to a stake, a corner of the Pope land; thence with that line N. 73 1/2 E. 8.23 chains to the corner; thence N. 19 W. 97 links to a stake, Oscar Seward's corner; thence on his lines N. 62 1/2 E. 15.20 chains to a stake; thence on his other line N. 40 W. 7.65 chains to a stake in a small pond, two pines and maple pointers, Oscar and Will Seward's corner; thence as W. P. Seward's line N. 68 E. 10.00 chains to a stake among pointers, his corner; thence on his other line N. 22 W. 10.00 chains to a stake, blackjacks pointers; thence with his other line S. 68 W. 19.90 chains to a stake, W. P. Seward's corner near the clay road; thence N. 21 1/2 W. 7.29 chains to a stake by the clay road, one pine pointer; thence N. 68 1/2 E. 5.90 chains to a stake, Oscar Seward's corner; thence as his line N. 10 W. 22.55 chains to a stake near Mill Creek, a pine and two blackgums pointers; thence direct to the beginning, containing 26.4 acres, more or less.
