Dr. Symington Urges Those with Any Suspicion of Trouble to Attend Clinics at Carthage

The Cancer Clinic begins next Monday. October 13th and will be held at the Public Health Office, Carthage from 9 a. m. to 12 noon during that week, Dr. J. Symington, Public Health Officer, announces. This will be the last publicity announcement possible before that date. October 13 to 18 is the week appointed for cancer campaign throughout the United States under the auspices of the American Society for the Control of Cancer. Cancer takes second place among the diseases causing death. In 1900 it occupied sixth place, tuberculosis occupying first place. Now cancer has so increased as to incidence and the cause of death that it now holds second place throughout the whole United States. This condition exists because cancer is neglected in its early stages and hence the planning of these clinics.
