Dunc McCrimmon Gives Figures To Prove Experiment Here a Success

Readers of The Pilot have noted my references to Dunc McCrimmon's crop of an unusual variety of red cotton, which he planted on the farm out the Lobelia road from Vass...

"We had exactly fifty-five acres of this red variety, and gathered forty-eight bales, or 24,000 pounds of lint cotton. The farming was done by tenants, who received one-half, or 12,000 pounds, while leaser or landlord received a like amount...

"I am sure there are many better farmers in this county than I am and I would like to see this variety of cotton placed in the hands of good farmers that would give it a better test than I have...

who did the planting and cultivation and harvesting. Mr. McCrimmon says further in his statement about the crop that it was a pleasure and a happy success, and all this in the face of low prices for cotton...

The land on which the crop was grown is a familiar tract on the Lobelia road, rather level, free from much washing, clay not very far from the surface, a fair type of Sandhill cotton land, not so good as much land in the state...

- Section 1. That all persons before engage in any business, trade, occupation or doing any act on which a license tax is imposed...
