Moore County Farmers Not Growing Enough Food and Feed, Says Report

Thousands of Dollars Leaving Home That Could Just As Well Stay Here

Moore county, in the center of the big Sandhills peach industry, is not growing enough food and feed to meet the requirements of its farm population of 11,400 and its livestock, and as a result is missing the mark set down by Governor O. Max Gardner for all counties of the state to grow and produce at home the things that they need for food and to make the farm show a profit.

Oats, milk, poultry, eggs, pork and hay are items which the farm citizens of the county are having to spend thousands of dollars on in outside markets if they are living up to the standards of the average citizen of the United States, a table prepared by O. F. Gaither, district agent of N. C. State College Extension Service, shows. The value of the deficiency in these crops is figured at \$477,966 and this represents good money that could be kept at home if the agriculturists of Moore were carrying out the "Live-at-Home" idea to its fullest extent.

While neglecting its food and feed crops Moore continues to give over considerable acreage to the production of cotton and tobacco, the so-called money crops of the state—crops in which declining prices are causing the farmers a great amount of distress.

Moore county has a surplus above its farm needs in beef and veal but it is sadly short on the production of hay to feed this stock. In fact hay leads the list of deficiencies in the county, the last available figures, those of 1929, placing the shortage of hay at 12,195 tons with a value of \$219,510.

Moore's milk shortage also runs up into six figures and unless farmers of the county are spending \$101,196 annually on the outside, for the purchase of 562,200 gallons, then they are going without and their families are not drinking the required amount of this important food and health item as is necessary.

To be a "Live-at-Home" county Moore must increase its productions on the following food and feed items by the amounts indicated:
 Oats, 87,000 bushels
 Poultry, 74,092 birds.
 Eggs, 80,225 dozen.

In Them Thar Hills

There's Gold, and It May Pay Soon to Exploit Moore County Mines

With the declining price of other things gold always rises in its relative value. This is making gold a more favored subject of search all over the world. Until the war raised things so high that gold was too low in comparison with other things to pay for hunting it considerable gold was produced in sections of Moore county. Of late with the lowered wages and prices and the higher value of gold a greater interest in hunting for the metal has been reported and occasionally some hopeful breezes in with a little color that he has washed out. The prediction is made that if things continue as they are more or less prospecting may be expected in Moore county this summer, and prospectors are always hopeful that the rainbow end will yet disclose that fabled pot of gold that has been sought for ages. Moore has considerable gold in modest quantities, and possibly enough to yield a favorable return if folks go after it and are satisfied with moderate recoveries.

Pork, 126 head.
 Farmers of the county are still banking heavily on cotton and tobacco for the farm income, and in 1929 a total of 3,485 bales of cotton was produced and 3,700,780 pounds of tobacco. Considerable profits if any from the crops, and the peaches, had to go outside for food and feed if the county came anywhere near meeting its requirements.

Moore showed a surplus above its farm needs on eight food and feed crops, the total of the surplus being \$168,883.
