NO TAXPAYERS' MONEY FOR CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE

Municipalities are not permitted to include contributions to chambers of commerce in their appropriations and budgets, but may, under the statutes, make appropriations for the support or aid of libraries, hospitals doing charity work, and other forms of charity, and Y. M. C. A. and Y. W. C. A. and other benevolent institutions, provided they do charity and benevolent work in the city.

These are general provisions, not taking into consideration any special provisions given to any particular town or city in its own character, Mr. Brummitt adds.

Municipalities may operate their own charities and hospitals, or may aid such work of other bodies, but they cannot aid chambers of commerce without a vote of the majority of qualified voters, he held.
