Popular Alumna of Pinehurst School Dies

Miss Lydia Sherber of Baltimore Passes Away at Moore **County Hospital**

The death of Miss Lydia Sperber of Baltimore, which occurred at the Moore County Hospital on Sunday afternoon. September 20th brought sorro wto her many friends in Pinehurst. 
