ASK AIR TIE-UP WITH EASTERN AIR TRANSPORT LINES

Knollwood Airport Will Run "Shuttle Service" to Raleigh if Application Is Approved

SANDHILLS-N. Y. IN 7 HOURS

If an application filed with the U. S. Department of Commerce is approved, the Sandhills will tie up to the Eastern Air Transport by "shuttle service" this winter, and it will be possible to jump into a plane at the Knollwood airport at noon and eat your dinner that evening in New York.

The application asks approval of an air line connecting the Knollwood field with Raleigh for the purpose of meeting the Eastern Air Transport's north and south bound planes each day. If the application is approved, operations will begin on December 1st and continue through the season, enabling Sandhills travelers to leave the airport at around 12 o'clock mid-day and arrive in New York at 7 p. m., or if southbound, to arrive in Jacksonville, Florida, before 6 p. m.

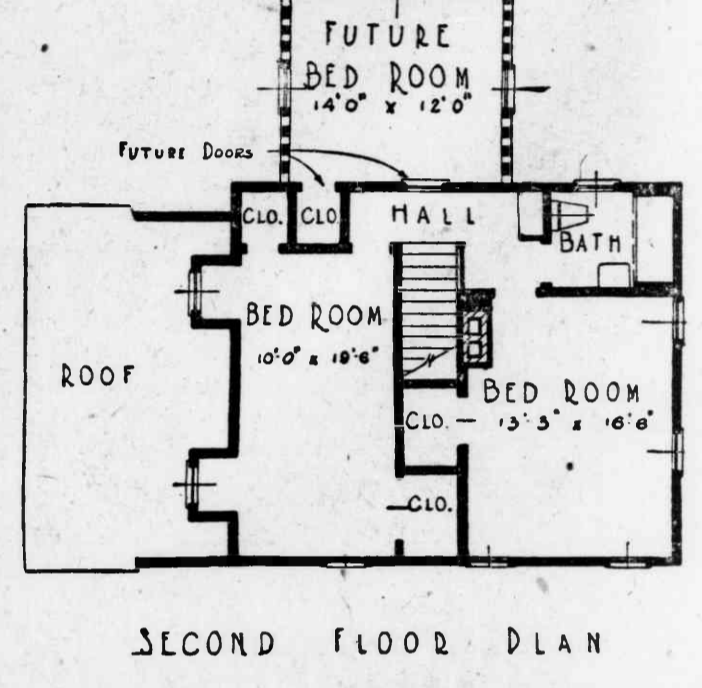
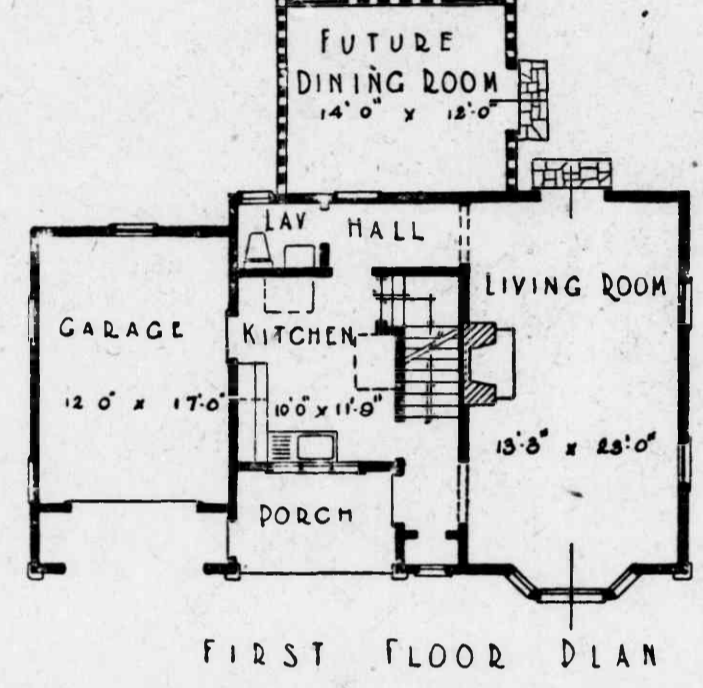

Home-Coming Day at University Saturday

Georgia Game Expected to Attract Scores of Alumni.—Many From Here to Attend

There will be big doings at the University of North Carolina this coming Saturday, October 17. It will be Home Coming Day for the Carolina alumni. The old grads will return in larger numbers than at any other time during the year. A crowd of 25,000 is expected. Many from the Sandhills plan to attend.

The feature event, of course, will be the Carolina-Georgia football game which will get under way at 2:30 o'clock. Just now it looks like those who attend will see the 1931 national football champions in action. Georgia has a clean slate to date and only last Saturday beat the mighty Yale 26 to 7.

If the Georgians lick the Tar Heels it is figured they'll stand a powerfully good chance of going the remainder of the season without defeat. In view of Georgia's tough schedule, which includes several intersectional contests, the Bulldogs will probably have every reason to claim the national championship if they go undefeated.

The Tar Heels are planning to put up their best scrap of the season in Saturday's big game, but whether they win or lose, the fans will get an eye full of some of the best football they'll have a chance to witness this season. For Georgia has some of the nation's outstanding players, among them "Jack the Ripper" Roberts, fullback, "Catfish" Smith, end, and Austie Downs, quarterback. Likewise the Tar Heels will show such stars as little Johnny Branch, the greatest small bit of human dynamite ever to step on a Carolina gridiron; Rip Slusser, the Blonde Blizzard, who scintillates at halfback, and a line that is undoubtedly one of the greatest in the country this year.

Tar Heel supporters believe Carolina will hold Georgia to a closer score than did Yale. Just how much closer is a matter for conjecture. Graduate Manager Charles T. Woolen and his corps of assistants are making ample arrangements for taking care of the large crowd expected, plenty of seats, and plenty of traffic cops to handle the crowd with a minimum of inconvenience to all visitors. The University town will keep open house.
