**OCTOBER WEATHER**

The official weather report for the month of October records but one and seventy-two one-hundredths of an inch of rain for the month, nearly an inch and one-quarter less than normal, and marking a total for the year of 40.18 inches, 3.68 inches less than normal, but 7.64 inches over the same period of last year. From August 23rd with the cessation of four days of rain, to November 1st, a period of sixty-nine days, just two-and-one-half inches of rain was recorded for this territory. An increase of temperature was also noted for this Autumn month, the average being 66-5, 3-7 degrees over the normal average of 62-8; the maximum being 79-9, minimum 53-1 as against the normal maximum of 74-5, and minimum 51-0. A high of 96 was recorded on the 7th, and a low of 35 degrees on the 18th.

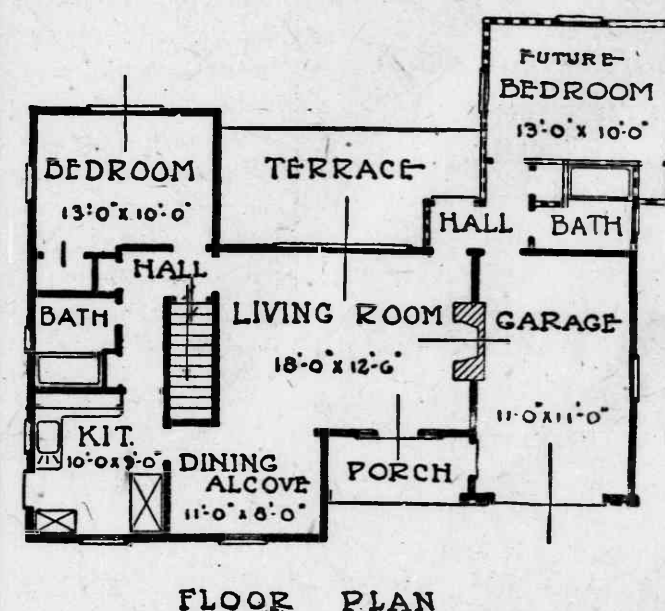

THE financing of a home keeps many of us from acquiring this most worthwhile of all possessions. Perhaps one of the difficulties in connection with financing is that prospective home-builders bite off more than they can chew. 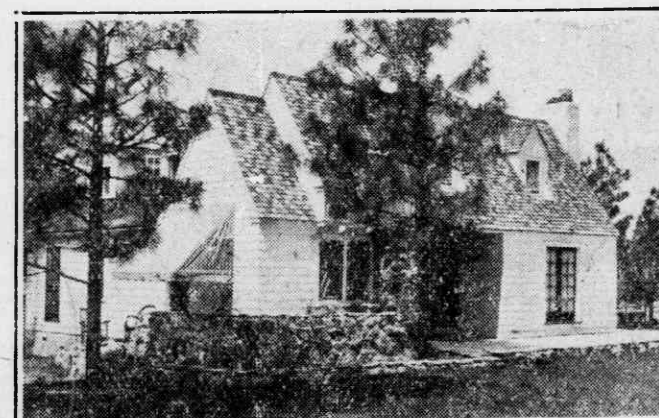
