Herbert Blue Dies of Heart Trouble

Was Stricken Suddenly While at Breakfast in Restaurant At Hamlet

Herbert Blue, a member of a prominent Aberdeen family, died suddenly at Hamlet, Tuesday morning while on his way to his work. He was employed as engineer on the Seaboard Air Line railroad yards, and was called to report for duty at an early hour view. that morning. On his way to work he stopped at a restaurant for breakfast, and just as it was being served to him his body suddenly slumped to the floor, and without making a sound, he died instantly, his death resulting from heart disease.
