#### COUNTY SHOWS SMALL INCREASE IN HIGHWAYS

Moore county had 137.6 miles of State highways and 540.4 miles of county roads on July 1, 1934, according to a survey made by the State Highway and Public Works Commission, as compared with 124.85 miles of State highways and 526.5 miles of county roads as of June 30, 1930.

In most counties an increase in mileage in both State and county highways is shown, but in some instance East Broad St., Southern Pines there is a shrinkage. This does not mean that some roads have not been added during the four-year period, but in many cases it was found that the 1930 survey of county roads, made in preparation for the State to take over county roads for maintenance, was inaccurate. In some cases roads were recorded that did not exist at all. The changes made since then have made the figures more accurate, but some mileage has been added in most counties


