

Dr. McBrayer Long Prominent in Medical and Civic Affairs

Is Official of North Carolina
Tuberculosis Ass'n. and
State Medical Society

Dr. Louis Burgin McBrayer, owner of the McBrayer Building informally dedicated this week by the opening of the Atlantic & Pacific Tea Company's store, has long played a prominent part in medical affairs in North Carolina and in civic affairs in this section.

Born in Buncombe county December 27th, 1868, the son of Adolphus and Lou Case McBrayer, he attended Judson College in Henderson from 1883 to 1886, and received his M. D. degree at the University of Louisville, Kentucky in 1889. He married Miss Lillian Cordie Deaver of Asheville in 1890 and they have three children. Reuben A., Mrs. P. P. McCain and Louis B. McBrayer.

He practiced medicine in Asheville from 1889 until 1914 and served as coroner of Buncombe county from 1901 to 1907 and as health officer of Asheville and member of the Board of Health of Buncombe county from 1909 until 1914 when he became superintendent of the North Carolina Sanatorium for the Treatment of Tuberculosis and became a leader in the fight against tuberculosis in this state.

Since 1915 Dr. McBrayer has been managing director of the North Carolina Tuberculosis Association, the offices of which are located in the new building. From 1908 until 1914 he was president of the State Board of Medical Examiners, and in 1915 was president of the Medical Society of the State of North Carolina, of which he has been the secretary and treasurer since 1921. The offices of this society are also located in the McBrayer Building here. He was president of the Southern Conference of the National Tuberculosis Association in 1925 and '26. He is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, A. M. A., and a member of the American Public Health Association and the Southern Medical Association.

Dr. McBrayer's activities have not been confined, however, to medicine. In 1903 and 1904 he was grand master of the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. He served as president of the Southern Pines Chamber of Commerce in 1929 and 1930, and was president of the U. S. No. 1 Highway Association in

1931. He was for many years active in the affairs of the Kiwanis Club of Aberdeen.

Dr. McBrayer makes his home with his family on his farm on the Aberdeen-Raeford road and maintains offices in the new building.
