### Parent-Teacher Month

Governor Ehringhaus has issued a proclamation designating and declaring the month from October 15 to November 15 as "Parent-Teacher Month in North Carolina, earnestly requesting all schools to hold special exercises, to be participated in by parents and instructors during the month "for the discussion of ways and means of improving the work of these associations and the worth-whileness of our educational enterprise." Governor Ehringhaus points out that these organizations have rendered valuable service to the schools and asks sympathetic observance of the month.

under the new reorganization, while officials state, as the quarter draws to an end, that the collections for the first quarter of the fiscal year are 25 per cent more than collections of the corresponding quarter last year. Field forces were in Raleigh last week getting full lists of names and amount of all delinquent in all kinds of State taxes and will "go after them" during the next few weeks. In some cases professional licenses, particularly of lawyers have not been paid for three or four years, and licenses will be revoked unless the taxes are paid.

### Farm Insurance

The Grange Mutual Fire Insurance Association of North Carolina has been chartered and organized, with home office at Raleigh, to write farm mutual fire insurance for grange members in the State. Incorporators are D. J. Lybrook, Advance; R. C. Adam, Salisbury; R. W. Fou, Winston-Salem; E. S. Van Atta, University; E. B. Garrett, Fayetteville; W. G. Yeger, Salisbury; Miss Pearl Thompson, Salisbury; W. Kerr Scott, Haw River; Frank Parker and M. G. Mann, Raleigh.

Every article in the by-laws has been approved by the Federal Land Bank, Columbia, S. C., the promoters say. The Land Bank requires that insurance on farm property on which loans are made and carried by companies meeting certain requirements, conditions which forced most of the local associations of a few years ago out of business and required insurance in old stock companies. The new association meets these requirements. An identical association has been formed in South Carolina and the two will cooperate and reciprocate fully. The membership is limited to members of the N. C. Grange.

### N. C. Man Honored

J. Dewey Dorsett, member of the N. C. Industrial Commission, was elected last week as president of the international Association of Compensation Boards and Commissions for the ensuing year at its annual meeting in Boston. The action is a worthy honor to the N. C. commissioner who had not been an officer before. As is the rule, the next annual meeting will be held in North Carolina. Cities mentioned are Asheville, Charlotte, Winston-Salem, Raleigh and Southern Pines. Usually the association promotes its vice-president to the presidency, but in this case, for some reason, this was not done.

### Stacy in Line for Promotion

Appointment of Chief Justice W. P. Stacy, of the N. C. Supreme Court, as chairman of President Roosevelt's newly created Textile Labor Relations Board, is considered not only a distinct honor to him and the State, but will place the N. C. chief justice in a favorable position for appointment as a justice of the United States Supreme Court if he satisfactorily accomplished the new task and a vacancy occurs during the administration of President Roosevelt. Chief Justice Stacy is already chairman of labor relations board for the steel industry and has served on several railroad arbitration boards, appointed by Presidents Coolidge, Hoover and Roosevelt. The new board is to settle the troubles between textile employers, probably the hardest yet tackled.

### More Money Asked

Requests for appropriations presented by the State's department, institutions and agencies for each year of the next biennium, to be presented to the 1935 General Assembly, are about \$7,000,000 a year more than was appropriated for each year of the present biennium, the Advisory Budget Commission, receiving requests last week, found. Most of this increase, \$4,200,000, was for increase in teachers' salaries and school needs. The commission is meeting again this week to try to juggle and work down together the amount of expected revenue and the appropriations it will recommend to carry on the State's activities. Increasing salaries of teachers and State employees generally is expected.

### BIG FARM AND HOME EXHIBITS AT STATE FAIR

Early entries and inquiries led today to a prediction by Norman Y. Chambliss, manager of the State Fair which opens Monday, October 8, that visitors will see the largest array of farm and home exhibits ever on display at the annual exposition. An outstanding flower show is in prospect, according to Charles Dearing, director of the floriculture displays.

### TO EXAMINE C. C. C. RECRUITS OCTOBER 13

North Carolina's quota of 2,138 juniors, ages 18 to 25, and 148 World War veterans with experience in the CCC camps for the fall enlistment are to be examined during the first two weeks of October, examining starting in the west and moving eastward, Mrs. Thomas O'Berry, State ERA director, states.

The quota is to be recruited through local relief administrators and will be sent to several convenient points for physical examination. If there is any question about the age, birth certificates or other evidence that the recruit is 18 years of age must be furnished. They must be single and from families now on or eligible to be on relief rolls, and must send \$25 each month to their parents.

Physical examinations for the quota of 27 recruits from Moore county will be held at Raleigh on October 13, Mrs. O'Berry announces.

### TAKES BIG FIGURES NOW

It's a far cry from the North Carolina of 33 years ago and the North Carolina of today, State Treasurer Charles M. Johnson says. The Treasurer's report of 1901 shows the total State debt them was \$6,527,770, while the debt today, less the sinking fund investments, is \$161,424,678.14. Total cash on hand that year was \$62,371.41, while today it is \$12,358,615.95, Mr. Johnson points out.
