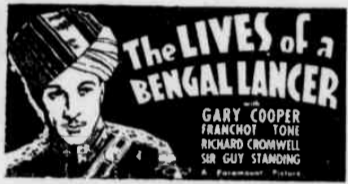

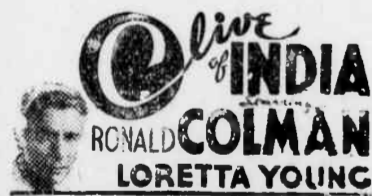

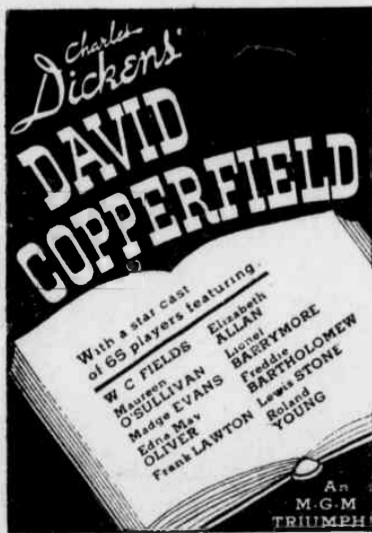

Ronald Colman and Loretta Young are the principals and 'Clive of India' the first million dollar production of Darryl F. Zanuck and Joseph M. Fields' Micawber is a picture broadly painted, but withal lovable and laughable. Edna May Oliver as the cantankerous Aunt Betsy tops all her

previous achievements. Roland Young as Uriah Heep is superbly shaded and perfectly projected. Lennox Pawle's Mr. Dick combines lunacy and wisdom with truly Dickensian versatility. Other outstanding members of the cast are Lionel Barrymore, Madge Evans, Lewis Stone, Frank Lawton, Elizabeth Allen, Maureen O'Sullivan, Basil Rathbone, Herbert Mundin, and Hugh Walpole.
