**Thomas Re-elected Head of Moore Co. Schools**

**Board of Education Elects Graham Chairman and Names Commitmen**

The reelection of H. Lee Thomas as county superintendent of schools for a two-year term and the appointing of school committeemen were the most important acts of the County Board of Education when it met on Friday afternoon of last week with W. P. Saunders of Hemp, W. B. Graham of Vass, F. W. Von Canon of West End and J. W. Graham of Aberdeen in attendance. The board elected J. W. Graham as its chairman and H. Lee Thomas as secretary.

The term of office of all school committeemen in the county under the general school law expired on April 1, 1935. The following were appointed for a term of two years:

Cameron: L. B. McKeithen, Mrs. G. M. McDermott and J. E. Snow.

Eureka: Murdoch Kelly, H. H. Fry and Z. V. Blue.

Hemp: Dr. J. F. Davis, Dr. W. N. McDuffie and Daniel A. Dunlap.

Pinehurst: Thomas R. Cole, I. C. Sledge and J. F. Taylor.

West End: John W. Monroe, Mrs. M. C. McDonald and W. A. Johnson.

For the Vass-Lakeview district, Redga Thomas was appointed to fill out the unexpired term of J. A. Thomas, deceased. The terms of the other Vass-Lakeview committeemen will expire in September, 1936.

The following notice of appointment was mailed to school committeemen on May 14th by Supt. H. Lee Thomas:

"This is to inform you that on May 10, 1935, you were appointed school committeeman for district—for a term of two years. I shall thank you to take the oath of office, meet the other members of your committee, organize, and report the names of your chairman and secretary at your earliest convenience.


"As the terms of all school committeemen expired on April 1, 1935 and it being unlawful for committeemen to elect teachers to serve beyond their term of office, any teacher elections by your committee done prior

to the organization mentioned above are illegal and should be validated by acting upon them again. The new law requires that the County Board of Education pass upon the election of all teachers. It will therefore be necessary to elect your teachers promptly and send the list of those elected to me."
