

Nicholson Freed of Murder Charge While Hackney Gets 10-12 Years

Former Pleads Self-Defense in Fatal Fight With Ira Little. —Bigamy Case Settled

"Not guilty" was the verdict of the jury in the outstanding murder case tried in Superior Court in Carthage last week, and John Nicholson, who for three years was a fugitive and who for the past several months has been in the county jail, walked out a free man.

Nicholson is alleged to have fatally stabbed Ira Little, his cousin and neighbor, of the White Hill section during a fight in which Little was said to have been choking and beating Nicholson, and the latter pleaded self defense. The unfortunate affair

occurred at a tenant house on Little's plantation.

The State did not ask for a verdict of guilty of first degree murder, but for a verdict of guilty of second degree murder or manslaughter. The State was represented by Solicitor Rowland S. Pruette, M. G. Boyette and J. C. Sedberry of Rockingham. W. R. Clegg and H. F. Seawell, Jr., appeared for the defendant.

A special venire of fifty Moore county men was summoned in the case of John Hackney, on trial for the alleged murder of Park Brewer, and eleven men from the regular panel and one from the special venire were selected as a jury. Hackney was found guilty of murder in the second degree, and was sentenced to serve from ten to twelve years in State's Prison.

Must Divorce and Marry

The case of Rich Clegg, thirteen-year-old boy who is the confessed slayer of his small cousin, was remanded to juvenile court.

Loren McQuoid, found guilty of bigamy, was given three to four years

in State's Prison, this sentence to be suspended upon payment of the costs and upon his proving to the Judge of the January term of court that he has obtained a legal divorce from his wife and lawfully married Miss Lucy Monroe, and the sentence shall not go into effect thereafter except on motion of the solicitor at any subsequent term within five years upon satisfactory proof that he has failed to provide and care for his said wife, Miss Lucy Monroe, after said marriage has been consummated. McQuoid, who married Miss Monroe, a highly respected young Moore county woman, about a year ago, has a wife and child in Canada, it has recently been learned.

Theodore Coleman, Lonnie Williams and James Anderson, colored men who are alleged to be members of a notorious gang of desperadoes that has been operating around Fayetteville, were given from five to seven years each in State's Prison for breaking and entering the Standard Store in Aberdeen, and on the larceny count they were given from five to seven years to begin at the expiration of the former sentence, the latter to be suspended for five years upon satisfactory proof that they have not violated any law.

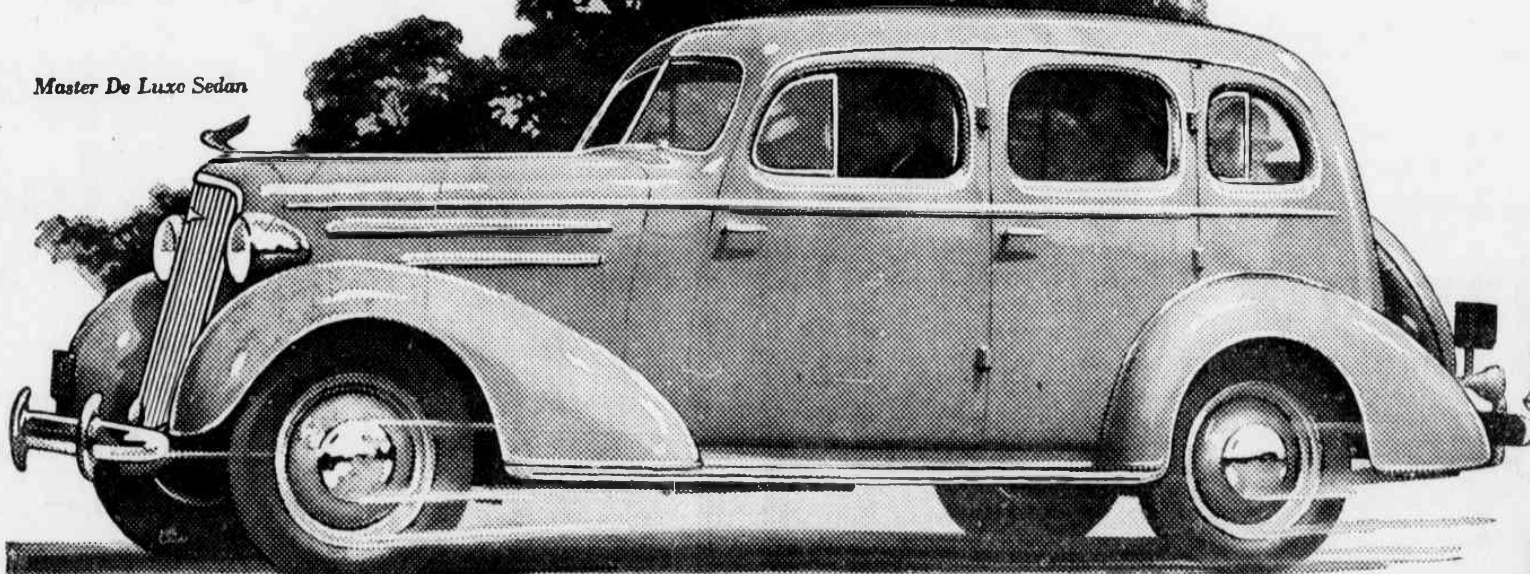

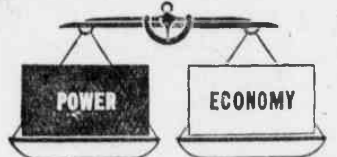
