To Build New Wing at State Sanatorium

Plans Passed Upon for Improvements and Additions at Directors' Meeting

Plans for improvements and additions to the present State Sanatorium were passed upon at a meeting of the board of directors held at the Sanatorium on Tuesday, and plans discussed for the new State Sanatorium to be erected in the western part of the state, W. H. Dietrick of Raleigh was named architect for the new institution, and Eric G. Flannagan of Henderson for the additions to the buildings near Aberdeen.

Senator Lee Gravely, chairman of the board, said a bungalow for doctors will be built at the present hospital, two houses would be erected for Negro attendants, a wing would be added for surgical cases, and segregation rooms would be arranged for patients who develop contagious diseases while being treated at the institution. An elevator also will be installed in the Negro building.

A committee composed of Laurie McEachern of Raeford, U. L. Spence of Carthage, and Dr. J. R. Terry of Lexington was appointed to look after this construction.
