**EDWIN THORNE DIES OF  
HEART ATTACK IN MAINE**

Edwin Thorne of New York, father of Landon K. Thorne, one of the owners of The Paddock in Southern Pines, died of a heart attack at the camp of his brother-in-law, Dr. Joseph A. Blake, in Maine on Sunday. He was 74 years of age. Mr. Thorne, a retired capitalist, was born August 3, 1861, at Thorndale, Millbrook, N. Y., a son of the late Samuel Thorne and Fhebe Van Schoonhoven Thorne. He attended the Hopkins Grammar School, New Haven, and was graduated in 1882 from Sheffield Scientific School at Yale University where he was noted as a tennis player.

With his father, Mr. Thorne was one of the founders of the New York Zoological Society. Until his recent retirement he was a trustee of the Mutual Life Insurance Company; a director of Granby Consolidated Copper Company; a director of the Federal Terra Cotta Company, a trustee of the Central Hanover Bank and Trust Company of New York, and a trustee of the Northfield Schools.

An enthusiastic sportsman, Mr. Thorne owned one of the largest hunting preserves in South Carolina, maintaining a winter home, Tomotley, near Yemassee, S. C., where he was a charter member of the Okatee Club. He was stricken with a heart attack at Tomotley two years ago, but apparently had recovered.

Mrs. Lawrence B. Smith of Millbrook, who resides in Southern Pines in winter, is among the surviving relatives.
