5 in Court Charged With Theft of Timber

Three Found Guilty of Trespass and Property Damage; Two Take Appeals

Neill, Robert and William J. McIntosh, Will H. Brown and W. C. Lassiter were charged with trespassing and cutting growing timber unlawfully from property of E. F. Kelly, M. C. McDonald and the R. L. Burns heirs. Brown, Lassiter and William J. McIntosh were found guilty. Brown and Lassiter were given 60 days each, suspended upon payment of three-fourths the costs, and McIntosh was given 30 days, suspended upon payment of one-fourth the costs and upon the further condition that the defendants refrain from trespassing on the property in the future.

Brown and Lassiter gave notice of appeal to Superior Court and bond was fixed at \$100 each. Neill McIntosh was found not guilty and Robert was not taken. All of the defendants are white men from above Carthage.
