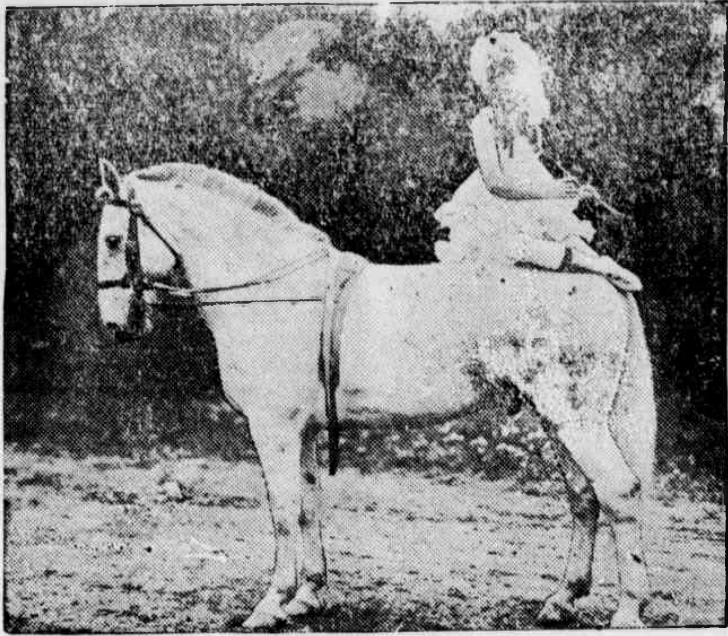

 The fire company made its usual quick response to the alarm, finding upon arrival the fire eating through the partitions and under the metal roofing of the Ferguson apartment. The flame were subdued with comparatively little damage to the house, and none to the furniture. The house, a two-apartment structure, is owned by E. W. Reinecke who within the past year completely renovated the apartments, one of which was vacant. The fire is supposed to have originated from an overheated water heater in the basement.
