

## Tennis Teams Here End Season with Victories

### Boys and Girls of Southern Pines High School Take Double Bill from Pinehurst

Last week both the boys' and girls tennis teams of Southern Pines High School closed the fall season with victories over Pinehurst.

The local netmen showed great strength in downing the Pinehurst boys by the one-sided score of 5.2. Spaeth met with little trouble in beating Fields 6.1, 6.4 in a battle of the number one men, while Beck won handily over Montesanti 6.2, 6.4. Grover had to go three sets before winning over Morton 6.2, 5.7, 6.4. Buchan was the victor in his match with Williamson 6.3, 6.4 but Milliken lost to Currie of Pinehurst by the score of 6.3, 6.1. Spaeth and Beck returned as the number one doubles team to chalk up a victory over Montesanti and Morton 2.6, 6.1, 6.0 while Grover and Milliken were losing to Williamson and Fields 6.3, 6.4.

Even less competition was given the Southern Pines girls when they crossed racquets with the Pinehurst girls last week, the locals winning six matches to none. Miss Ward won over M. Wicker 6.2, 6.0. Miss Eddy topped J. Griers 6.1, 6.3; Miss Montesanti defeated E. Wicker 6.0, 6.3. Miss Wrenn beat O. Currie 6.2, 6.0; Miss Barnum overcame L. McKenzie and Miss Kelley ran over E. McKenzie to round out a perfect singles day. The Misses Wren and Montesanti, as the top doubles team overwhelmed the Misses Wicker and Griers 6.1, 6.2 while Misses Ward and Eddy defeated Misses Currie and Wicker.
