\$4,515 FOR COUNTY IN RENTAL, BENEFIT PAYMENTS

North Carolina received \$1,042,676 of the \$71,612,285 distributed in rental and benefit payments by the AAA during July and August, the Department of Agriculture announces.

The payments for the nation were divided as follows: Corn, hogs, \$35,399,954; wheat, \$13,247,251; sugar, \$10,033,078; cotton, \$8,351,244; tobacco, \$2,134,065; and rice \$2,446,689.

Of the North Carolina payments, \$717,814 was for cotton; \$238,468 for tobacco; \$2,289 for wheat and \$85,103 for corn-hogs.

Moore county's share of the North Carolina distribution was \$4,515.59.
