Dr. Leiby Completes 20 Years of Waging War on State's Bugs

Formert Resident of Aberdeen Came Here in 1915; Now State Entomologist

Annually by methods suggested to crtizens of the state by one man, millions of bugs are put to death in North Carolina. The man who is responsible for the deaths of the insects probably knows as much about them as any man in the state, for bugs are just as much the business of Dr. Rawland W. Leiby as azalaleas are his delight, says the Raleigh News and Observer. Dr. Leiby is a former resident of Aberdeen and a frequent Sandhills visitor.

Dr. Leiby recently celebrated the 20th anniversary of his coming to North Carolina as assistant State entomologist, a post he left Cornell University in 1915 to accept. For ten years he held down the job so well that in 1925 he was made State entemologist, a post he holds today.

Since he has been entomologist, his office has been an important news center on numerous occasions, among them being during the Florida fruit-fly quarantine in 1929, the return of the 17-year locusts two years ago and during the invasions of the boll weevil in the cotton fields.
