

Dr. Leiby Completes 20 Years of Waging War on State's Bugs

Former Resident of Aberdeen Came Here in 1915; Now State Entomologist

Annually by methods suggested to citizens of the state by one man, millions of bugs are put to death in North Carolina. The man who is responsible for the deaths of the insects probably knows as much about them as any man in the state, for bugs are just as much the business of Dr. Rawland W. Leiby as azaleas are his delight, says the Raleigh News and Observer. Dr. Leiby is a former resident of Aberdeen and a frequent Sandhills visitor.

Dr. Leiby recently celebrated the 20th anniversary of his coming to North Carolina as assistant State entomologist, a post he left Cornell University in 1915 to accept. For ten years he held down the job so well that in 1925 he was made State entomologist, a post he holds today.

Since he has been entomologist, his office has been an important news center on numerous occasions, among them being during the Florida fruit-fly quarantine in 1929, the return of the 17-year locusts two years ago and during the invasions of the boll weevil in the cotton fields.

Rowland Leiby was born in Allentown, Pa., in 1892, but after 20 years of this state prefers it "very decidedly" to his native territory. Graduating from Muhlenberg College in 1912, he continued his education at Cornell University and returned there in 1921 to take the degree of doctor of philosophy.

The entomologist does not confine his interest to bugs and things pertaining to them. He is actively interested in gardening, especially in the growing of azaleas, and is secretary of the State Association of Nurserymen.

A singer, he served for two terms as president and is now serving his fourth term as secretary-treasurer of the Raleigh Male Chorus. Active in the affairs of the Lutheran church in Raleigh, he is superintendent of the Sunday school.

He is fond of hunting—especially of hunting alligator and deer.

For four years he served as trustee of Lenoir-Rhyne College. Since 1930 he has been secretary of the National Plant Board, and was vice-president of the American Association of Economic Entomologists. He also is a member of the Entomological Society of America and the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Under the CWA, Rowland Leiby directed a \$108,000 project of pest mosquito control and now is directing two Federal WPA projects on blister rust control and abandoned orchard eradication.

Dr. Leiby married Miss Pauline Strauss, of Elmira, N. Y., and they have two children, Sarah Jo and Rowland Leiby, Jr.

Experienced Home Economist To Demonstrate Meat Canning to Housewives

Miss Gladys Kimbrough, home economist, will give a lesson on canning meat in the home demonstration office in Carthage next Wednesday, December 18 at 10 o'clock.

Miss Kimbrough has had wide experience in foods, including teaching home economics both in rural and city high schools, working several years as Home Demonstration Agent; managing a school cafeteria and later a large commercial cafeteria; acting as foods editor for a magazine; broadcasting tested recipes for southern cookery; and serving five years as educational director for a national organization of millers.

Miss Kimbrough has taught home canning to large groups of women in 24 states for several years and has met most of the questions that can be asked about food preservation. She includes the answers to the more than usual ones in her lecture demonstration. This period is always followed by taking up the individual canning problems of those who attend. All methods of canning are discussed. She says: "How many women really have model kitchens? Very few. Then isn't it important for me to show how to do the best in the average home?"

Miss Kimbrough studied at Teachers College, Columbia University emergency cookery and food preservation and was one of the pioneers in teaching the then "new way" of canning.

Miss Flora McDonald, home agent, says that every woman in Moore county is invited to this demonstration.
