#### "TROUBLE MAKER"

Culled from Sports Editor Jake Wade's column in The Charlotte Observer:

William Garrard, the new publicist at Camden, is not keeping secret the activities of the resort colony, and his stories are interesting. And he is attracting attention of the citizens of the North Carolina resorts, as witness an excerpt from a letter we have just received from Publisher Nelson C. Hyde of The Southern Pines Pilot.

Mr. Hyde encloses a clipping from a recent story by Mr. Garrard in which the latter reported that Trouble Maker, a horse that won the Carolina cup race several years ago and later competed at Aintree, England, trained at Camden. Mr. Hyde wants history kept straight. "Trouble Maker," he writes, "trained at Southern Pines, not Camden, and was ridden to victory in all the leading American steeplechases by Southern Pines' own Noel Laing, and by him in the Grand National at Aintree."

Mr. Hyde prefaces the observation with a note that the friendliest possible relations exist between Camden and Southern Pines and that the letter concedes the former is much further advanced in steeplechase racing, but Southern Pines is on the rise and wants its due.



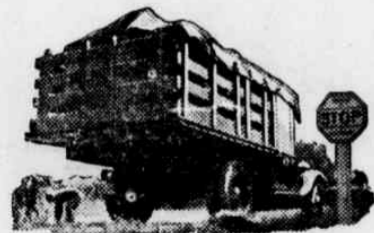
