At Pinehurst

That curious mixture of contradictions — of childish, mischievous pranks, deep-rooted emotions and innate honesty—which goes to make up the average boy has been brought to the screen in all its compelling truth in "Too Many Parents," the attraction at the Pinehurst Theatre Monday, March 30th, matinee and night. "Too Many Parents" tells the story of four boys, typical of hundreds of thousands the country over, who, for one reason or another, have been deprived of the most precious birthright of all children—the guidance and love, the tender affection and instruction of their parents. "Too Many Parents," with Frances Farmer as Sally, and Lester Matthews as Phil's father, features Buster Phelps, Billy Lee, George Ernest and Sherwood Bailey as the juvenile stars in this story of boys "without parents" thrown together in the military boarding school.

"Love Before Breakfast," the attraction at Pinehurst Wednesday, April 1st, matinee and night, is the kind of show that's all fun, there never being a serious moment in it, even though there are occasional bits of drama to contrast the dominating hilarity. Built upon the premise that a man and a woman can't get along either with or without each other this picture stacks up as the kind of attraction for any kind of audience. "Love Before Breakfast" is portrayed by a trio of principals who have scored notable successes in recent pictures, Carole Lombard, Preston Foster and Cesar Romero. Janet Beecher plays Miss Lombard's mother.

"Farmer in the Dell," the attraction at Pinehurst Friday, April 3rd, matinee and night, is from the author who wrote "State Fair," Phil Stong and ran serially in the Saturday Evening Post. "Farmer in the Dell" features Fred Stone, who is perfectly adapted to the role of the Iowa farmer transplanted to Hollywood, and he makes the most of a part that is very reminiscent of the roles that the late Will Rogers played in pictures. Stone has much of the rough-diamond qualities and naturalness of Rogers. "Farmer in the Dell" is along the old lines of the ambitious mother who wants to see her daughter crash Hollywood and marry above her station socially instead of hooking up to the lad of her choice. Besides Fred Stone, the cast includes Esther Dale, Moroni Olsen, Jean Parker, Frank Albertson, Maxine Jennings and Lucile Ball.

Clark Gable as the husband, Myrna Loy as his wife and Jean Harlow, as the lovely secretary who innocently finds herself in the reluctant role of "the other woman," provides one of the greatest screen "triangles" in the history of romantic films. It has been achieved in the new and popular Faith Baldwin story of modern metropolitan romance, "Wife versus Secretary," playing a return engagement at the Southern Pines Theatre, Monday, Tuesday, March 30, 31 and April 1st with a Tuesday matinee. In this new and up-to-date theme, Clarke Gable justifies himself as one of the three international box-office champions, recently acclaimed by a nationwide poll of exhibitors. Jean Harlow departs from her usual types of roles to play Gable's secretary, the sage yet lovely business confidante who eventually prevents the total wreckage of his happy marital life. It is a dramatic story of how biased maturity and not so innocent childish immaturity can play havoc with the course of true love. The story is that of two women who operate an exclusive younger girls' school; they are also in love with the same man. As a result of an innocent event, seen and later related by an ultra-wise and incorrigible brat to her doting grandmother, a situation is precipitated that brings the partners into court before a jury of rigidly moralistic New Englanders. "These Three" has been handsomely served by its cast and production staff. Merle Oberon gives her finest performance to date at Karen, while Miriam Hopkins and Joel McCrea are scarcely less effective as the other two sides of the ill-fated triangle.
