Rainless May

Weather Report Shows 3.75 Inches Less Than Normal **Expectation for Month**

In extreme contrast to the flooded months of winter and early spring rainfall for May registered only thirty_eight one-hundreths of an inch, 3.75 less than the normal expectation, thus reducing the excess of 12.37 inches to 8.58 inches, this long continued arid spell causing a wide spread and disastrous drought.

Despite the rainless days prevailing breezes gave us an agricable month, 24 days of which were clear, six part cloudy, and one cloudy. Four days gave us a high of 95, the low of 42 coming on the 15th. Average temperature for the month was one degree above the long time normal, and five degrees above the average for last May.
