

Revolutionary Step in Tuberculosis Fight

Geram-Killing Ray Developed by Dr. Deryl Hart of Duke Successfully Tested

Development and use by Dr. Deryl Hart, chief surgeon at Duke Hospital, of what has been described as a "new type of cool germ-killing ray that destroys air-floating bacteria about the patient on an operating table" promises to become a revolutionary advance in the treatment of pulmonary tuberculosis by means of chest surgery, according to an article in the July issue of the Sanatorium Sun, official organ of the Extension Department of the North Carolina Sanatorium.

Dr. Hart announced the results of his use of this ray a short time ago at a meeting in Rochester N. Y., of the American Association for Thoracic Surgery, his paper being based upon operations he had performed at Duke Hospital, including among his patients many from the North Carolina Sanatorium.

"Members of the Sanatorium medical staff have commented with enthusiasm upon the results of the use of this ray," the Sanatorium Sun article declares. "They have pointed out that the patient's reaction is greatly reduced, the considerable rise in temperature that in the past has been accepted as an inevitable aftermath of an operation, has been greatly reduced—sometimes almost to the point of elimination—and the incision heals much more quickly, thus reducing appreciably the time that has to be spent in the hospital after the operation. The newspaper reports stated that 50 persons had been operated upon under these rays, which are used for other types of operations as well as those performed on tuberculosis patients of course. Of this 50 many were patients and ex-patients of the North Carolina Sanatorium."

Dr. Hart's contribution to surgical science is said to permit, for the first time in the history of surgery, the continuous sterilization of the air in an operating room. It has been described as "the final step in safety from infection which began with Joseph Lister's inauguration of antiseptic surgery in 1865."

The rays are produced by long, slender tubes which frame the lights above the operating table. There rays are selected wave-lengths of ultra-violet, which kill air-borne germs in 60 seconds but do not burn human beings.

"All the patients operated on under the radiation of these tubes," Dr. Hart was quoted as saying, "had an unusually smooth convalescence. There have been no infected wounds. There has been less temperature elevation, less pain, and a more rapid convalescence."
